

Their Families*, edited and with interviews by Peggy Gillespie.

Through interviews and photo portraits, the subjects of *Authentic Selves* (Skinner House Books, 2023) invite readers into their real lives—their revelations, challenges, joys, and networks of support. From the foreword by transgender activist Jazz Jennings and her mom and fellow activist, Jeanette Jennings, through the resources offered at the book's end, this Common Read invites UU groups to explore the nature of living authentically and the ways connections among us help us thrive.

As the book ends, Peggy Gillespie, who conducted the interviews, writes, “the journey of self-discovery continues for the participants and for you, the readers. Whether you are trans and/or nonbinary, questioning your identity, have trans and nonbinary loved ones, or perhaps all of the above, please remember always that you are not alone. In every moment of your lives there are opportunities to strengthen your pride and acceptance of all people, including yourselves.”

This Common Read offers two parallel discussion tracks: one for a UU group with any or mixed gender identities, and one for UU participants with a trans or nonbinary identity. Each discussion guide consists of four 90-minute sessions that religious professionals or lay leaders may facilitate in-person or online.






“Wind, stop blowing!” shouts Benjamin Snooks. Until one day the wind answers back in this playful and light-hearted story about flexibility and accepting change.

But when Benjamin Snooks tries to stop the wind from blowing—or at least escape it—he discovers that making peace with it is a wiser path.

*Wind, Stop Blowing!* reveals the problems we create when we cling too tightly to our expectations of how things ought to be. It gently invites children to consider better ways to respond to life’s small setbacks and changes. Ages 4–8.

*Craft as Spiritual Practice*—Andrew writes with deep empathy for the emotional journey when a work is done, through celebration and grief, decisions around publication, the angst of receiving negative feedback or rejection, and the sometimes surprising challenges that come with success.

Anyone—amateurs and professionals alike, those who intend to publish and those who do not, those with book-length manuscripts and those with haiku written on paper scraps—can do this practice. This book is for anyone who wants to release their work with love.





It offers heartfelt wisdom on preserving connection, self-care, and staying open to the possibility of grace.

## Social Change Now

To engage in social change at this moment in time requires consistent attention, deep reflection, and committed collective action. But how can we effectively anchor our commitments to equity, solidarity, and justice?

This is the entry point for *Social Change Now*, Deepa Iyer's heartfelt offering to individuals and groups seeking to initiate or deepen their actions in service to social change values. Relying on two decades of work supporting social movements, Iyer introduces the social change ecosystem framework, which includes a map of ten roles, from builder to storyteller to disrupter to experimenter, as well as practices to identify values and strengthen our social change ecosystems.

*Social Change Now* is a practical guide that contains detailed descriptions and real-world examples, reflection prompts with room to write responses, and accessible tips that can immediately be put into action. It is a resource that will accompany individuals and organizations throughout their lifelong social change journeys to build connected communities and equitable systems in our world.

**DEEPA IYER** currently helms the Solidarity Is program at the Building Movement Project, where she creates narratives, provides trainings, and facilitates networks around social change and solidarity practice. She served as executive director of South Asian Americans Leading Together (SAALT) and has held positions at Race Forward, the US Department of Justice's Civil Rights Division, the Asian Pacific American Legal Resource Center, and the Asian American Justice Center. An immigrant who moved to Kentucky from India when she was twelve, Deepa graduated from the University of Notre Dame Law School and Vanderbilt University.







Du Bois Legacy Award, Harris is also a teaching artist in the Kennedy Center's Changing Education Through the Arts Program and co-president and director of music education for the Living Legacy Project. He continues to inspire audiences with messages of joy, unity, and peace through his powerful live performances.



## Spilling the Light




## The Tending Years

REV. KAREN VAN FOSSAN is an abolitionist, ordained minister, licensed professional counselor, and former defendant in the Line 3 pipeline resistance.



## Unlocking the Power of Covenant


Commission on Appraisal
